### **Public Hearing Regarding Selection of Early Voting Centers**

The Montgomery County Board of Elections has scheduled a public hearing to receive testimony from the public about the list of Early Voting Centers for the upcoming gubernatorial election. Each local Board of Elections in the State of Maryland is required to review its list of early voting sites every two years and make recommendations to the State Board of Elections. The Montgomery County Board is seeking public input prior to making its recommendations, which are due at the end of November. The public hearing will be held at 10 a.m. on Saturday, September 23, 2017, in the Lobby Level Auditorium of the Montgomery County Executive Office Building, 101 Monroe Street, in Rockville. In addition, public comments will be heard during the September 18 and October 16, 2017, meetings of the Board of Elections to be held at 2:30 p.m. in the Board Room of the Board of Elections in Gaithersburg.
