President's Report

MD 97 Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Randolph to MD 108 meeting on June 26th from 4-8 pm at Parkland MS, Cafeteria

Looking for a volunteer to assist with GOCA communication – email/website/maybe even Facebook. No writing required – you will be given what needs to be sent and/or posted. Estimate 2-4 hours total a month (usually in short increments) but one day turn around needed. Training provided.

Summary of Solana Assisted Living meeting held on May 8th (thank you Kathy Curtis for attending):

Present were two of the principals of the developer/Formation-Shelbourne, two representatives from the Lake Hallowell HOA and the neighbors to the west of the facility. The developers responded to questions on a variety of topics:

- The facility is now on schedule to accept residents on September 10, 2012. The date could change but they don't expect any major delays.
- Models will open later in May. They are taking contracts now and two have been confirmed.
- There are 79 units with a total of 94 beds. There is a website with limited information <u>http://www.brookdaleliving.com/solana-olney.aspx</u>.
- The facility has both an assisted living section and a memory care section. The latter is the third floor and is a locked unit.
- Brookdale Senior Living has been hired as the operator of the facility. They have a website at <u>www.brookdaleliving.com</u> if you would like more information. They are hiring now.
- Rates are in the \$3500-\$5000 per month range. The exact amount will depend on the level of care and assistance that a resident requires. The facility will not provide skilled nursing care. Hospice will be available as needed.
- There are single and double units and they range in size from 425 sf to 800 sf. Each room has a private bathroom. Residents will furnish their own units. Common area furnishings will be provided.
- The number of staff present depends on the shift. The first shift from 6AM-2PM will have 25-30 staff both full time and part time. The other shifts have fewer staff.
- There were questions about landscaping for noise control and for privacy. The developers will continue to work on those issues with the affected neighbors.
