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Round Table Discussion for Civic and Homeowner Association Boards

Whole group:

Apathy - getting people to serve on the board and/or come to annual meeting (or at least send in proxy)

Communication - newsletter, website, emails. What works, how is it paid for, who does it? Vandalism, known drug activities, litter, loose dogs, dog poop (pros/cons of bags & trash cans for dog poop)

MHP/HOC rentals - problems with house maintenance or tenants

Speeding within the community

Parking – cars, commercial vehicles, and/or trailers on streets. Lack of spaces (especially in townhouse areas) since people use their garages as storage space so that space is no longer available for a car.

Civic Associations:

Getting voluntary dues - what works Community building events (parades/picnics/yard sales) Why are some associations doing well and others are not?

Homeowner Associations:

Landscape contracts - costs, deer prevention, leaf pick up
Dues collection issues
Asset inventory and capital reserves
Pool - maintenance, safety, personnel, outside memberships, insurance costs
