Board of Education - In Montgomery County, a Board of Education district means a geographic area in which an elected member of the Board must live. In Montgomery County there are five resident-district members and two at-large members of the Board; however, all Board members are elected by the county as a whole. MC 7-13 is pending legislation to change to 5 district members (voted by only those in that district) and 4 at large members (voted by the entire county). OLD BUSINESS -

Recommendation from the Officer's Committee:

Resolved that GOCA's President is authorized to formally notify Parks & Planning of GOCA's concerns about provision of adequate access to southbound Georgia Avenue for residents of Batchellor's Forest Road while maintaining BFR's status as a rustic road. Such concerns including informing Parks & Planning that current southbound access is provided by cutting through the County park service road to use the Emory Road traffic signal; informing Parks & Planning that the County park service road is inadequate for handling the additional traffic associated with the new homes in the proposed Polinger property development; and requesting that Parks & Planning provide an appropriate plan for accessing Southbound Georgia Avenue in the context of approving the development plan for the Polinger property.
