The Office of Consumer Protection has received complaints from residents receiving calls from people claiming to be IRS agents. These so-called agents may demand payment over the telephone, by wire transfer or gift cards. The IRS will NEVER call you on your return and demand money this way. If you get this false call, record the telephone number, any other information and report it to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration through its online reporting form or at 1-800-366-4484.
