County Council's New Website

Call-n-Ride Program

The Call-n-Ride Program has changed the age eligibility from 67 to 65. Call-n-Ride provides discounted taxi service to low-income older people and adults with disabilities. Christmas Tree Curbside Pickup

Residents with county-provided curbside recycle collection can leave their Christmas trees at the curb for pickup on their scheduled pickup days. The trees should be completely "undressed": no tree stand, decorations, lights, ornaments, tinsel, garlands wired together or any other metal or plastic. Live Christmas trees with root balls and artificial trees cannot be collected as yard trim. To dispose of your artificial tree, put it in your trash bin if it's small enough. If it's too big for that, request a bulk trash pickup by calling 311.
