The GOCA officers unanimously support House Bill 0817. Although \$20,000 will likely not cover the entire cost of a large system, it does offers an incentive for gas stations to make the capital investment of a generator for their pumps, stores, and cash registers. Even if only one gas station in an area chooses to acquire a generator, the entire community will benefit. Emergency responders and essential personnel at hospitals and nursing homes will be able to get to work.
